Title IX Report and Toolkit Statement

As part of a Title IX lawsuit brought by Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia, a federal district court in Kentucky ruled that the 2024 Title IX Regulations are invalid and must be set aside. According to the following <u>guidance</u> the ruling likely vacated the 2024 Title IX regulations in schools nationwide.

At this point, The Commission and the Title IX Working Group (established by <u>Public Act No. 23.66</u>) cannot predict any changes the federal government will make, to the 2020 Title IX Regulations. Currently, schools are advised to discontinue use of policies and regulations that follow the 2024 Title IX regulations and resume using those that were in place under the 2020 Title IX regulations. For district specific Title IX questions or concerns it is recommended that you consult with your school district's Title IX Coordinator.
