- **I. CALL TO ORDER** Co-Chair Alan Tan called the meeting to order at 10:32 am
- II. WELCOMING AND Co-Chair Tan opened the quarterly CWCSEO Advisory Board meeting CONVENING REMARKS with a warm welcome and shared a reminder that a Doodle Poll will be FROM CO-CHAIRS sent to everyone soon to schedule the upcoming 2025 advisory board meetings.
- III. CWCSEO PRIORITIES Executive Di the commiss LEGISLATIVE SESSION underway: : FOCUS 1.

Executive Director, Melvette Hill outlined the following priorities that the commission will focus on for 2025 in addition to work already underway:

- 1. Youth and Young Adult Civic Engagement
- 2. **Health:** addressing mental health, maternal health, female genital mutilation/cutting (FGM/C), reproductive health, and disability rights
- 3. **Minority Teacher Recruitment** and **Retention** and **School Safety**
- 4. **Family Caregiving including** the growing number of grandparents taking on caregiving roles for their grandchildren
- 5. **Housing Policy** with emphasis on rental insecurity
- 6. **Immigration Issues**
- 7. Food and Nutrition Insecurity
- 8. **Environmental Issues**
- 9. **Two-Generation (2GEN) Family Economic Mobility,** workforce development, and predictable scheduling fair work week wages
- 10. **Child Tax Credit**
- 11. **Benefits Cliffs**
- 12. Civic Engagement



Additionally, staff raised the following areas of importance:

- 1. Absentee voting and early voting.
- 2. Anticipated mass deportations under the new administration and the State's role in providing support.
- 3. A legislative proposal to create color-coded envelopes for individuals with cognitive and physical impairments and training for law enforcement and first responders.
- 4. School meals and the emergency food system
- 5. Language access
- 6.
- 7. Expanding awareness of Long-Term Care and Community Ombudsman programs, focusing on improving dental healthcare access for seniors.
- 8. The concept of a "floating holiday" to address the needs of different Asian-specific holidays.
